

Boreal Chickadee

Poecile hudsonicus

Description

The Boreal Chickadee is a typical member of the chickadee family: noisy, active and highly social. It is a very small bird, although considered 'large' by chickadee standards (weighing in at .2 - .4 oz or 7-12 g, 4.7-5.5" or 12-14 cm long). It has a dull brown cap, rufous (rich brown) sides and flanks and whitish cheeks, wears a black bib, has a tiny dark bill and short dark tail. All members of the Boreal Chickadee family share the same brown toned colouring. The Boreal Chickadee has the same flight pattern as its other chickadee relatives: it makes short flights from place to place on rapidly beating wings, alternating a few quick shallow strokes then pulling its wings to its sides to glide briefly before beating them again.

FUN FACTS

- > Boreal chickadess are year-round residents of the boreal forest seen in NE & NW portions of Alberta.
- Chickadees can lower their body temperature in the winter from 49 C to 29 C to conserve energy.
- > Pairs remain together, perhaps even mating for life. They nest in holes in trees.
- > They cance food in the fall to help survive the cold Alberta winters.
